NOVEMBER FEASTS: In five days we celebrate two major feasts that are deliberately back-to-back in the Church's Tradition: the **Feast of All the Saints, Friday, November 1st**, and the **Commemoration of the Dead, All Souls Day, Saturday, November 2nd**. They are connected: the Church is the Body of Christ, and thus she continues through time as well as eternity.

Once baptized, one is always a member of the Body, whether still living, or deceased. Those living now are called the Church Militant, still serving the Lord and following His Gospel. The Communion of the Saints in Paradise is our final goal and destiny. God begins sainthood through Baptism, and calls us to become saints. They are the Church Triumphant in heaven. This Feast is so important that ***all Catholics are obligated to participate in the Mass*** that day. The morning Mass on Friday will be at Saint Jude in Mineral at 9:00 a.m. The evening Mass will be at 7:00 p.m. at Immaculate Conception in Buckner. On All Souls' Day, November 2nd: We also have the duty to pray for those who have died, who are in the hands of God, Who in His mercy, may grant forgiveness and everlasting Life with His Saints. We pray on All Souls Day for the Church Suffering, the souls in Purgatory, that they will be admitted into Paradise. There will be a Mass on Saturday Morning at 9:00 a.m. at Saint Jude to commemorate All Souls' Day. It is not a holy day of obligation, but all are invited to pray and offer the Mass for the faithful departed.

Electronic Giving to begin at Saint Jude: Over the past few years many of our parishioners have inquired about making their church contributions electronically. This optional method of contributing is referred to as

“e-Giving,” for those who prefer this method of giving. The company who will offer this service is called *Faith Direct*. *Faith Direct* enables parishioners to make your Church contributions through either direct debit from your checking/savings account or through your credit/debit card. No more writing checks or searching for envelopes on the way out the door. Now you can apply the convenience of direct debit to your parish offerings in much the same way as you may now use it to make your mortgage, car or tuition payments. *Faith Direct* also offers you personalized offertory cards to replace your envelopes for the collection basket. Election Day is November 5th

Voters will elect members to all 140 seats in the Virginia General Assembly - 40 in the Senate and 100 in the House of Delegates. To be good Catholics and good Virginians, we must - with consciences well formed through prayer and the Church’s teachings - participate in these important decisions. As you prepare to vote, we offer these thoughts on weighing vital issues at stake, drawing from Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, a statement of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (www.faithfulcitizenship.org) which describes how we make good moral choices as we respond to our baptismal call to promote the common good.

Many issues are important. “Every human being has a right to life, the fundamental right that makes all other rights possible, and a right to have access to those things required for human decency - food and shelter, education and employment, health care and housing, freedom of religion and family life” (Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, no. 49). We must be attentive and engaged whenever human dignity is at stake for any of our brothers and sisters in the human family - whether they are born or unborn, rich or poor, a newcomer or of U.S. origin. This attentiveness and engagement includes addressing the frequency and severity of gun violence in Virginia and across the country.
