
Clean grocery bags from a smoke free home are always needed.

NOVEMBER FEAST DAY MASSES

All Saints Day Masses - A Holy Day of Obligation Wednesday, November 1, two Masses: 9:00 AM, At Immaculate Conception 6:00 PM, At Saint Jude (note time)

All Souls Day Masses - NOT a Holy Day of Obligation Thursday, November 2nd, two Masses: 9:00 AM, at Immaculate Conception and 6:00 PM at Saint Jude (note time)



NOVEMBER FEASTS: There are two major feasts that are deliberately back-to-back in the Church's Tradition: the Feast of All the Saints, Wednesday, November 1st, and the Commemoration of the Dead, All Souls Day, Thursday, November 2nd. They are connected: the Church is the Body of Christ, and thus she continues through time as well as eternity. Once baptized, one is always a member of the Body, whether still living, or deceased. Those living now are called the Church Militant, still serving the Lord and following His Gospel. The Communion of the Saints in Paradise is our final goal and destiny. God begins sainthood through Baptism, and calls us to become saints. They are the Church Triumphant in heaven. All Saints is so important that all Catholics are obligated to participate in the Mass that day. There will two Masses on Wednesday November 1, in the morning, 9:00 AM, at Immaculate Conception and in the evening, 6:00 PM, at Saint Jude.

On All Souls' Day, November 2nd: We also have the duty to pray for those who have died, who are in the hands of God, Who in His mercy, may grant forgiveness and everlasting Life with His Saints. We pray on All Souls Day for the Church Suffering, the souls in Purgatory, that they will be admitted into Paradise. There will be two Masses on Thursday, in the Morning, at 9:00 a.m. at Immaculate Conception, and an evening Mass, at 6:00 P.M. at Saint **Jude** to commemorate All Souls' Day. It is not a holy day of obligation, but all are invited to pray and offer the Mass for the faithful departed.

The Rosary is recited starting at 8:30am before the Daily Mass at each Church


